Gilbert Sterling Dies in Syracuse Hospital

Stricken With Cerebral Hemorrhage Saturday—
Lingers Until Tuesday Morning—Burial in Dexter

Gilbert Sterling of 324 W. Onondaga street, Syracuse, died at 8:30 Tuesday morning in the General hospital. Mr. Sterling had visited here from time to time and a year ago last winter spent several months with his brother, W. [William] D. Sterling, of the Sterling House. He had many friends in Camden who regret to learn of his death. While out for a motor ride Saturday Mr. Sterling was stricken with cerebral hemorrhage. Taken to the hospital, he never rallied.

The deceased was born in Mason City, Iowa 49 years ago, and at the age of six years came with his parents to Mannsville, N.Y. He was a son of Mrs. Martha Wilder Sterling and the late Adolphus Sterling. Until his health failed three years ago he had been a paper mill superintendent. He was twice married. His first wife was formerly Addie Dell of Philadelphia, N.Y., and his second wife was Hazel Smith of Copenhagen.

He is survived by his wife and one son, Ralph, of Rome; his aged mother, Mrs. Martha Sterling, of Camden; a sister, Mrs. Orville Reed of Oneida, and two brothers, Claude of Dexter, N.Y., and W. D. of Camden.

The remains were taken to Dexter, N.Y., the old home of the family, and funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. today in the Universalist church.
