WILLIAM STERLING, HOTEL OWNER, DIES
Conducted Hotel In Camden for 13 Years; Operated Grill in Rome

William D. Sterling, 67, proprietor of Sterling Grill in Rome and the Sterling Hotel in Camden, died Saturday at his home, 45 Mexico St., Camden. He had been ill a week, having suffered an attack of pneumonia.

Mr. Sterling came to Camden from Syracuse 13 years ago, when he purchased the Erwin House and renamed it Sterling Hotel. He established his grill in Rome last year. Prior to his brief residence in Syracuse, Mr. Sterling spent most of his life in the vicinity of Watertown. He was a communicant of the Universalist Church at Watertown.

Born at Ellisburg, N. Y., January 6, 1868, the son of Alolphus and the late Martha Sterling, Mr. Sterling married Hattie L. Diamore March 15, 1890, at Watertown.

Surviving besides his widow and father, are two sons, Clare and Franklin, Camden; a brother, Claude, Dexter; and a sister, Mrs. Maude Reed, Lockport, and three grandchildren in Camden.

Funeral services will be held on Tuesday at 2 p.m. at his late home. Burial will be made in the family plot at Dexter.
