Alvin Stewart

Alvin Stewart, who had been in feeble health for some time, died at his home in Morris early Wednesday morning, January 22d, aged eighty years.

Sometime before the Civil War Mr. Stewart married Miss Emma Mann of that town and went to the Middle West where as a civil and contracting engineer he was employed by railroad corporations in Michigan, Indiana, Illinois and other States. Four children were born to them. Three of them and the mother died in Michigan. One grew to womanhood and married Amos King of Tennessee, and had two children who now reside in the State of Washington. Mrs. King is dead, but Mr. King was in Morris to attend the funeral.

Mr. Stewart returned East many years ago and he and his sister, Eliza Stewart, have made their home together here. Mr. Stewart has long been a respected resident of Morris and we have with sorrow watched his gradual decline in health and his sister is assured of heartfelt sympathy in her loss. Mrs. Almon Lull of this town and Mrs. F. E. Leonard of Schaghticoke are also sisters of the deceased. The funeral was held Sunday afternoon at the house, the Rev. F. [Frederick] G. Leonard [Universalist] officiating. The remains are being taken to Michigan for burial beside the wife and little children of the long ago.—Morris Chronicle
