DEATHS.

She was a kind hearted, amiable and lovely girl; and by her mild and gentle deportment while in health, she had secured the affectionate regards of all her numerous acquaintances; so that the members of her family were not the only ones who sincerely and deeply mourned her departure from among us...

Her funeral was attended at the Universalist church, on the afternoon of Sunday, the 10th inst., where an immense throng of sympathizing friends and acquaintances freely mingled their tears with those which were shed by the sorrow-stricken relatives. The funeral services were performed by Rev. H. L. [Henry] Hayward, Pastor of the Universalist society, assisted by Rev. Mr. Morrill, Chaplain of the prison. (Cayuga Patriot)
