DEATH OF MRS. SARAH A. STONE

In the death of Mrs. Sarah A. Stone, of 50 Clark street, Auburn loses one of its oldest and most respected inhabitants. Mrs. Stone has been a resident of this city from the time when it was a hamlet called Hardenburgh's Corners. Mrs. Stone was born in Albany in 1802, where she lived until she was [15?] years old. She married Gardner Stone in her eighteenth year and moved to this town directly afterward. Her maiden name was Sally A. Denniston. They moved to Auburn about seventy years ago. Mrs. Stone has always been an attendant in the congregation of the Universalist church. She leaves four children living of eight born to her. The oldest daughter is Mrs. Henry A. Hawes of Syracuse, who is in her sixty-ninth year. Her oldest son, Henry A., was lieutenant colonel of the third artillery, and died in 1869 of yellow fever contracted while in the service. The only son now living is John D. Stone of Syracuse.
