G. Archie Storrs Dies at Hospital

Funeral services were held here on Monday afternoon at the Lawrence Funeral Home for G. Archie Storrs, who died at Hepburn hospital on Friday following a short illness.

Rev. Edna Bruner, pastor of the Universalist church, conducted the services. Burial was made in Fairview cemetery.

Mr. Storrs was born at Morrisburg, Ont., Canada, on Nov. 19, 1876, a son of the late Archie and Anna Williams Storrs. He attended the local schools and when his family decided to come to this country, Mr. Storrs selected Canton for his future home. He was 18 years of age at the time and soon after his arrival he took a job as tailor with the Remington Clothing store.

Later other members of his family including his mother and father also moved to Canton and made their permanent homes here.

Mr. Storrs left the employ of the Remington Clothing store and opened a tailoring shop of his own in the second floor of the block now occupied by the Grand Union store.

In 1926, together with his son, Arthur, he purchased the business where he had first worked, then the Canton Clothing company. The name of the business was changed to the Storrs Clothing store and Mr. Storrs continued active in the business until his death.

On June 1, 1896, Mr. Storrs was married to the former Miss Florence Powell, a daughter of the late John and Celestia Powell of Canton.

He was a member of the Canton Universalist church, the Canton club, St. Lawrence Golf club, and the local horseshoe pitching club.

Survivors include his wife; a son, Arthur of Canton; two daughters, Mrs. Howard (Mabel) Jenkins of Canton and Miss Frances Storrs of Easton, Pa.; one grandchild, Sharon Jenkins; three brothers, Fred L. of Watertown, Harry of Canton, and Charles of Chicago; and two sisters, Mrs. Wilfred (Helen) McKinney of Watertown and Mrs. Clarence (Mable) Wilkinson of Watervliet.

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
