MR. CICERO F. STOUT

On June 29, the roll call into the Great Beyond was answered by Mr. Cicero F. Stout, a life-long resident of this community [Olcott] and for many years a well known Niagara county fruit grower, following an illness of several months.

Mr. Stout was chairman of the board of trustees in the First Universalist Church of Olcott, also, for several years, treasurer of the Niagara County Association of Universalists. At all times he gave most generously of his time and money to the various interests of the local church.

Of sterling character, generous and friendly in disposition, Mr. Stout was held in high esteem by a wide circle of friends. He was a devoted husband and father in the home, a sincere friend among his fellowmen and loyal at all times to the cause of faith which he so greatly loved.

Rev. H. Philbrook Morrell of St. Lawrence University and a long time friend of the family, conducted the funeral service, assisted by Rev. Ethel A. Knapp, D.D., pastor of the Lockport-Olcott Universalist churches.

The Newfane Masonic Lodge, of which Mr. Stout was treasurer, attended the service in a body and conducted the burial at the Lakeview cemetery, Olcott.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Nettie Burroughs Stout, a daughter, Mrs. Henry Dietrick of Lucedale, Miss., a brother, Benjamin Stout of Rochester and a sister, Miss Mary Stout of Olcott.
