DEATHS.

In Manchester, Michigan, Nov. 23, 1844, Mr. WILLIAM STOWELL, formerly of Otsego county, and late of Westfield, Chautauque [sic] county, N.Y., aged sixty four years. It is enough to say of father Stowell that as a citizen he was highly respected by his acquaintances, for the strict integrity of his life; and that as a Christian, he was a Universalist both in theory and practice. He has been an efficient member of the Universalist church in this place since its organization three years ago; but left us in October last to visit his son in Michigan, where he soon after terminated his mortal existence.

He died as he had lived, a Universalist. His loss is, and will continue to be, sensibly felt by the Universalist church and community in this place; but it is ours to be reconciled to the will of Heaven. We submit without a murmur.—May the Father of spirits comfort his surviving relatives and friends with the consolations of the Gospel.
