William Stuckey of Clarendon passed away at an early hour Tuesday morning in the Batavia Hospital where he had been a patient for several weeks.

The journey was made by sailing vessel and they were on the water seven weeks between Plymouth and Quebec, where they took another boat for Charlotte. The trip from Rochester to Holley was made by the packet Jennie Lind. Mr. Stuckey had always resided in Clarendon and vicinity.

He is survived by three nieces, Mrs. John E. Morton of Clarendon, Mrs. Mabel Turner Southworth of Batavia and Miss Eileen Lawrence of California; two nephews, Harry E. Turner of Batavia and Ernest O. Lawrence of San Francisco, and several grandnephews and nieces.

Funeral services will be held this (Thursday) afternoon from the Clarendon Universalist church, Rev. L. [Lewis] R. Robinson officiating, and interment will be made in Hillside Cemetery.
