FUNERAL OF C. J. STUPP

The funeral of the late Charles J. Stupp was held from the family home, No. 214 West Genesee street, Tuesday afternoon at 4 o'clock. There was a large attendance of sympathizing friends. The Knights of Pythias and members of the G.A.R. attended in a body. The services at the house were conducted by Rev. A. [Arnold] S. Yantis, pastor of the First Universalist church. The services at the grave were in charge of the Pythian fraternity. A squad from the Second Separate company consisting of Corporal Aikes, Private [Simpson?], Abar, Knapp, Johnson, Shoecraft, Hoskies, Bucken and Ibbotson acted as honorary bearers and fired a military salute over the grave on Fort Hill. "Taps" was blown by B. Frank Harney.

The floral tributes were unusually profuse and beautiful. The bearers were Chauncey L. Hickok, John Kalland and Daniel Edson, comrades of the One-hundred-eleventh regiment and E. J. Jewhurst, George Wilson and George R. Turner from the Knights of Pythias.
