MISS MARY STUPP, TEACHER FOR 50 YEARS, DIES AT 81

Miss Mary A. C. Stupp died this morning in the 81st year of her age. She was born in New York City July 31, 1842 and came to this city about 52 years ago and has resided at 106 Wall Street practically all of that time since. Her demise came as a shock to her many friends in this city where she was well known in church and school circles.

For over 50 years she was a teacher in the Seymour Street School and for a time acted as principal, retiring a few years ago. She was a life long member of the First Universalist Church and was active in its affairs.

The deceased leaves one brother, J. B. Stupp; one sister, Miss Carrie E. Stupp; five [sic] nephews, Elmer F. Stupp, Fred J. Stupp, Eugene W. Stupp, George E. Stupp, and four nieces, Mrs. May Irish, Mrs. James H. Carmody, Mrs. G. B. Lewis and Mrs. John Davis, all of this city.

The funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the home of her nephew, Charles F. Stupp of 45 Grover Street, with Rev. Dr. Charles H. Vail, pastor of the First Universalist Church, officiating. Burial will be in Fort Hill Cemetery.
