Death again entered our midst, Wednesday, June 9, and took another of our oldest residents, Mrs. Emma Hunt Sturtevant. She had been in poor health for several years, but the final illness only covered a period of a few days. She contracted a severe cold, which she was too weak and feeble to overcome.

Emma Hunt was born in Kent, England, 79 years ago. The family came to America when Emma was 14 years of age and settled in this village, and the entire life of the deceased since that time has been lived here in Hubbardsville, so she was well known by all and had many friends, although not caring for social life, preferring to remain in her home with her family. About 60 years ago she was married to Oscar Sturtevant of this town, who passed away several years ago. To them were born three children, all of whom are living: Mrs. Fred Clark of Utica, Wilmer Sturtevant of Ilion and Dean Sturtevant of Beverly, N.J. Mrs. Sturtevant was a member of the Universalist Church of this place, but for many years had not been able to attend on account of poor health. Besides the children mentioned, the deceased is survived by two brothers, Robert and Thomas Hunt of Kansas, and one sister, Mrs. James Sturtevant of this place, who lived in the house adjacent to her sister's home. There were also ten grand- and great-grandchildren. A private funeral was held at the house Saturday and burial was made in the cemetery here.
