HUBBARDSVILLE MAN PASSES SUDDENLY AWAY

Harold Frederick Sturtevant, 58, died unexpectedly May 4, 1947 in his home in Hubbardsville. Early in the afternoon he went to the garage in the rear of the house, where he suffered a heart attack. Death was instantaneous.

He was born Dec. 14, 1888, son of the later Wilmer O. and Jessie Dunbar Sturtevant. He attended Colgate Academy and the late Taylor Society of Engineers in New York.

On March 10, 1919 he married Lila M. Jones in Waterville.

In 1922, they went to Detroit where Mr. Sturtevant was associated with the Acme White Lead and Color Works. He became assistant treasurer of the company, serving in that capacity until early this year, when he returned to Hubbardsville and [sic] purchased the business of L. D. Thayer & Sons, which he has operated since.

He was a member of the Universalist Church, the City of Straits Lodge, 452, F. & A. M., Detroit, and was one of the founders of the Detroit Historical Society.

Surviving besides his wife are a brother, Marion F. Sturtevant, Hubbardsville; three sisters, Mrs. Neil J. Parker, Wilton, N.Y, Mrs. Clarence Chismore, Ilion, and Mrs. William Guifoil, Hubbardsville.
