Mrs. Clark E. Sutherland

At her home on Hancock street at 1 o'clock this afternoon, says the Little Falls Times of May 3rd, occurred the death of Mrs. Frances Mary Sutherland. Death was due to a stroke of paralysis sustained Wednesday morning. Her condition was critical from the start, tho' she rallied sufficiently to recognize her children. Mrs. Sutherland's maiden name was Frances Mary Russell, and she was born in Greenwich, Washington county, on March 1st, 1850. Her parents were early settlers and among the most influential residents of that section. On August 1, 1866, deceased was married to Clark E. Sutherland of St. Johnsville, the ceremony being performed at Palatine Bridge by Rev. Mr. Hippee. In 1877 Mr. and Mrs. Sutherland came to Little Falls to reside. He was a well known central railroad employe[e], whose death occurred some years ago [on Feb. 10, 1905, from injuries sustained in a train accident]. During her forty years' residence in this city Mrs. Sutherland won the respect and esteem of the community. She was a woman of dignity, of character, neighborly and sympathetic, and her demise causes deep sympathy for those who were near and dear to her. Ever since her residence here she has been a member and active worker of St. Paul's Universalist church and exemplified in her daily life the teachings of the Master. There survive one daughter, Mrs. Frank D. Deuel of Schenectady, and one son, George C. Sutherland, also of Schenectady.
