ORLANDO SUTHERLAND

Orlando Sutherland passed away Monday, May 24th, at 9:30 o'clock at the home of his niece, Mrs. George Flansburg, where he has¹ been ill for nearly four months. Mr. Sutherland was born in Fly Creek Valley, September 9, 1845, and was a son of John and Lucile (Hyde) Sutherland. He was married to Maggie Freeman of this village, who died October 23, 1896. Mr. Sutherland had been in poor health for about a year and while on a visit with relatives at Canastota he fell, injuring himself quite badly, and as soon as he was able he came to the home of his niece where he has been tenderly cared for, but he has gradually failed and the end came very peacefully, for he has been a very great sufferer. He has held a position with the New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad company for the past thirty-two years and made his home in New Haven, Conn. He was a member of the F. & A.M. Lodge of this place. He leaves to mourn his death, besides the two nieces, Mrs. George Flansburg and Miss Margaret Bliss who have cared for him, two own nieces, Mrs. Janet Carrington of Syracuse, Mrs. Clarence Bliss of Iliion and one own nephew, Lewis Sutherland, of Herkimer and also the following other nieces and nephews: Mrs. Lowell Downs and Dever Bliss of Little Falls; Harry Bliss of Herkimer; Volney Bliss of Baltimore, Ind., Morgan Bliss of Hartford, Conn., Fred Plumb of Fairport; also two sister-in-laws [sic], Mrs. Etta Plumb of Canajoharie, Mrs. Ida Twogood of Canastota and several great nieces and nephews. The funeral will be held Thursday at 2 p.m. from the home and 2:30 p.m. from the Universalist church. The Rev. Geo. C. Boorn will officiate. Burial in the family plot in the village cemetery. The Masons will have charge of the services at the grave. Sympathy is extended to the bereaved family.
