JOSEPHINE ALMY SWIFT
Aged Resident Succumbs to Stroke of Apoplexy

Mrs. Josephine Almy Swift, widow of the late Dr. Charles E. Swift, died suddenly last evening at her home, corner of William and Genesee streets, of cerebral hemorrhage. Mrs. Swift suffered a stroke of apoplexy a year ago and recently while in general good health gave indications of a re-currence of her former attack. Last evening she complained of being ill and her family physician, Dr. Allen E. Baker was summoned but she suffered another stroke and died before medical aid reached her.

She was 84 years of age and is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Satie E. Lyon of Newark, N. J. and three grandchildren. The funeral arrangements have not been completed. The services will be held on Monday afternoon at Mrs. Swift's home and burial will be made at Fort Hill cemetery. Coroner Foreman, who was notified because of the sudden death, declared that death was due to cerebral hemorrhage.
