HARMON E. TABER

Word was received here Sunday morning of the death of Harmon E. Taber at Stryker, Ohio, who passed away the night before, after lingering since March 31st, when he was stricken with paralysis. He went there last fall to spend the winter with his daughter, Mrs. Gertrude Mignin, wife of Dr. C. F. Mignin.

He was the son of Col. Stephen D. Taber, and was born on the farm that he has owned for many years, in 1840. He married Miss Jennie Pettibone of Michigan in 1870, and two children were born to them, Miss Isabelle Taber of Castile and Mrs. Gertrude Mignin of Stryker, Ohio.

Mr. Taber was one of Castile's representative farmers. His home on the Middle Reservation road, "Maple Row," consists of 125 acres of the best land in the town. The house was built of small stone and was erected in 1849. From there a picturesque view can be obtained east across the Genesee Valley into Livingston county.

The remains were brought to Castile Tuesday morning and taken to his home on the Reservation, from which place the funeral services were held on Wednesday at ten o'clock, and the remains were taken to Perry for burial. Rev. Clara Morgan of the Perry Universalist church officiated at the service.
