MRS. ANN M. TALCOTT

Mrs. Ann M. Talcott died at her home in North Brookfield just as the sun was rising on the morning of May 5th, after a brief illness of one week, of pleuro pneumonia. Mrs. Talcott was born in Madison, June 10th, 1824. Her maiden name was Crowfoot. Of a family of six brothers and sisters but one survives. [On] Jan. 18th, 1854, she was united with Samuel Talcott in marriage. Three children were born to them, one, Minnie Alice, dying in infancy; two are living, Mrs. Herbert [Mary] Throop, of Hubbardsville, and Charles Talcott, of North Brookfield. After twenty happy years together they were separated by the death of Mr. Talcott, twenty-three years ago. After her marriage Mrs. Talcott always lived in this town, with the exception of two years in Waterville, most of the time being spent on the farm now owned and occupied by her son. Eleven years ago, with her sister, Mrs. A. R. White, she moved to this place, which has since been her home. For many years she has tenderly ministered to the invalid sister. And upon her the blow falls with crushing force. Yet with her oldtime sweetness and patience she calmly looks forward to a glad meeting in the heavenly land by and by. To her and the sorrowing children and grandchildren, and to her faithful friend and attendant, Florence Madden, is extended the sympathy of all. Mrs. Talcott was a devoted wife and mother, a kind friend and neighbor, always ready with a word of sympathy and cheer and to aid in every good word and work. Love and respected by all she will be greatly missed. The funeral services were held from the Universalist church the afternoon of May 7, the interment taking place at Hubbardsville. May the God of all comfort and love, grant to the sorrowing hearts sweet peace and consolation, and when the white winged angel comes may they be ready to join her in that land of light and beauty where they never say goodbye.
