MRS. WILLIAM TEATER DIED LAST FRIDAY Well Known Whitesville Woman Succumbs to Carcinoma of the Stomach. Funeral Was Held Sunday From Universalist Church.

Kathryn Agnes Teater, wife of William Teater of Whitesville, died at the family home Friday afternoon, July 23, 1915, of carcinoma of the stomach, following an illness of over fourteen weeks, seven weeks of which were spent in the Wellsville Hospital.

Mrs. Teater was a member of the Universalist church, the Universalist Ladies' Aid society and Whitesville Rebekah Lodge. While quiet and retiring by nature, she never shirked a responsibility and was active in promoting whatever she considered was for the betterment of those with whom she came in contact. During all her suffering she was kind and patient, and was the subject of the most tender care that medical skill and a devoted family could give.

Funeral services were held at the Universalist church Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

The church was packed with sorrowing friends and relatives. The Rebekah order attended in a body, Rev. DeWitt Lamphear delivered a very eloquent sermon, and a mixed quartet rendered a number of appropriate selections. The floral tributes were many and profuse. Burial was in Rural Cemetery.
