CHESLEY A TEED DIES

Chesely Allison Teed, 60 years old, an inspector in the employ of the Board of Education for the past 15 years, died on Tuesday of a complication of ailments, at his residence, 354 Ocean ave., Flatbush. Mr. Teed had been a member of All Souls Universalist Church, Ocean and Ditmas aves., for about 12 years, and the pastor, the Rev. Dr. A. Eugene Bartlett, will conduct the funeral services at his late home tomorrow evening. The interment, on Friday, will be in Greenwood Cemetery. Mr. Teed was born in Wentworth, Nova Scotia, on September 4, 1858, the son of John and Mary Brown Teed. He came to Brooklyn about 40 years ago, and had been a resident of Flatbush for 30 years.
