DIES IN BLACK RIVER
Mrs. Emily Ten Eyck, 80, ILL BUT THREE DAYS, PASSES AWAY
Did Not Have Physician in 47 Years

Black River, July 8.—Mrs. Emily Ten Eyck, wife of Charles Ten Eyck, passed away at her home in upper Maple street about 10 Saturday evening, at the age of 80 years. Death was due to acute dilation of the heart. Mrs. Ten Eyck was ill three days.

In 47 years Mrs. Ten Eyck had not required the services of a physician. She had been in excellent health up to the time of her last illness.

Mrs. Ten Eyck was born in Black River, Nov. 24, 1837, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Osborne Baker. She had always lived in this vicinity. She was married 57 years ago to Mr. Ten Eyck, who survives her. She is also survived by one son, John H. Ten Eyck, postmaster of this village, and by two grandchildren, Mrs. Katherine Eggleston and Stuart Ten Eyck, both of Black River.

The funeral will be held from the late home tomorrow morning at 10:30, Rev. George D. Walker [Universalist] of Carthage, officiating. Interment will be made in the family lot in Black River cemetery.
