MRS. EMMA JANE TERRELL

Mrs. Emma Jane Terrell, widow of Albert Terrell of 40 Railway-ave., died early this morning [30 Aug 1926]. She was taken ill last Tuesday at her home and was taken to the hospital where she underwent an operation. The operation was successful and Mrs. Terrell was improving when a complication set in which resulted in her death at 1 o'clock this morning.

The deceased was born in Preble, Sept. 1, 1848, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Perry. She came to Cortlandville with her parents when she was 18 years of age and resided on what was formerly known as the Daniel E. Smith farm just off the gulf road. She married Albert Terrell of Cortlandville, Dec. 11, 1871, at her home west of this city. The Rev. William N. Tower, a former pastor of the First Baptist church, performed the ceremony.

Mr. and Mrs. Terrell were for years engaged in the grocery business on Railway ave., where Mrs. Terrell has made her home for the past forty years. The deceased was a member of the local Universalist church.

The funeral will be held Wednesday at 1 o'clock at the home on 40 Railway ave. Rev. J. [Joseph] A. Judge of the Universalist church will officiate. Interment will be made in Cortland Rural cemetery.

Her age was two days less than 78 years, and sixty years of her life were passed in this city. She was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Perry and was born at Preble. Her husband for many years had a grocery store in Railway avenue. Mrs. Terrell was one of the oldest members of the Universalist church, and the pastor recently called to the church, Rev. J. [Joseph] A. Judge, came from Oneonta on Wednesday to conduct her funeral service. Burial was in Cortland Rural cemetery.
