JAMES TERRY

The funeral of James Terry, who died on Thursday night at his residence, 602 Jefferson avenue from heart failure, will be held at his late residence at 2 o'clock to-morrow afternoon, the Rev. Arnold S. Yantis, of the Universalist Church of Good Tidings, officiating. Mr. Terry, born in Taunton, Mass., in 1829, had been a resident of this city sixty years. He was an engineer in the employ of the New York Ferry Company for forty-five years, and lived most of that time in Grand street, near Ewen street, in the Fifteenth ward. Three years ago he resigned his place because of failing eyesight, and since then had lived in comfortable circumstances in the house in which he died.

He was a Republican all his life, and complained to his relatives of his inability to get out and register before the last election. He was a member of the Ferrymen's Engineers Association, and was for more than fifty years a member of Crusaders Lodge No. 61, I.O.O.F., having entered the latter when the New York Lodge became merged with it.

He is survived by a widow and three married daughters—Mrs. Abbie Kennedy, Mrs. Clarissa Neidig and Mrs. John S. Mitchell—the latter being the wife of Brooklyn's City Treasurer under Mayor Howell's administration.
