## WILLIAM H. TERRY DIES

William H. Terry, one of Southold's most prominent men, died at his home Sunday, following a short illness of pneumonia. He was stricken while assisting in working a degree in the Odd Fellows' Lodge on Monday night and was assisted to his home, pneumonia later attacking him.

Mr. Terry, who was in his 78th year, was born in Southold¹ and has been very active in many public and private enterprises all of his life. For twenty-four years he was a trustee of the Southold Savings Bank and for many years had served on its finance committee. For many years, too, he was secretary of the Board of Education. In the Odd Fellows' Lodge he was particularly active, having served in every official capacity. He was also a member of Peconic Lodge, F. & A. M., Greenport.

He is survived by his widow, Isabelle G. [Glover] Terry<sup>2</sup>, and one son, Israel P. [Peck] Terry, an assistant treasurer in the Southold Savings Bank. Funeral services were conducted a 1 p.m. Tuesday, from the Universalist Church, by the Rev. Abram Conklin<sup>3</sup> and with a service by the Odd Fellows at the grave.
