MRS. GEORGE W. THOMAS  
Death of a Former Resident of Corfu at Her Home in Buffalo

Corfu, Dec. 14.—The remains of Mrs. Amelia Taylor Thomas, widow of George W. Thomas, who died at her home, No. 31 Ada place, Buffalo, on Monday, were brought here yesterday afternoon for interment in Evergreen Hill cemetery.

Mrs. Thomas died from nephritis, after having been confined to her bed several weeks. She was born in Corfu on December 24, 1843, and in the spring of 1887 was married to Mr. Thomas, who died on Oct. 11, 1909. She is survived by a niece, Miss Ina Taylor of Cleveland, O.; five cousins, D. H. Turner of Mendon, William Turner of New Hampton, Ia., Miss Clara Hutton, who resided with Mrs. Thomas, Truman Hutton of Buffalo and Mrs. Charles Broker of Corfu, and two uncles, W. L. Darrow and Asa K. Darrow of New Hampton, Ia.

Those who accompanied the remains to Corfu were Miss Taylor, Miss Hutton, W. L. Darrow and D. H. turner, Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Sumner, Mr. and Mrs. George Phelps, Roy Duguid and Bert Baker of Buffalo and Mrs. Henry I. Brown of Rochester.

There were services yesterday morning at the family home in Buffalo, conducted by the Rev. H. [Harry] M. Wright [Universalist] of Lockport.
