SPRINGFIELD CENTER

Charles P. Thompson, whose death occurred at Cooperstown [on 2 Jan 1906], was, when a youth, a resident of this village. His father, the late Charles F. Thompson, was principal of the Thompson High School, which was on the third floor of the Central Hotel. Then the building was owned by Pier, Brooks & Co. Mr. Thompson was elected school commissioner for this district and served two terms and during this time the deceased attended the district school. He also attended the Universalist church here. The family after residing here several years moved to Schuyler Lake. There are a few here now who attended school with Mr. Thompson. He was always looked upon as a fine scholar and showed great ability as a learner.

The body of Charles P. Thompson was brought here from his late home at Cooperstown Friday, and buried in the family lot in the cemetery. Many friends sympathize with his mother and sister, who reside here, as well as the other members of his family.
