FUNERAL OF JONATHAN THOMPSON

One of Webster's Oldest Residents. Born Where Died.

Webster, Dec. 20.—The funeral of Jonathan D. Thompson, one of the oldest residents of this town, who died last Saturday at his home, on the Holt road, was held from his late home yesterday, at 2. P.M. Rev. C. A. Simmons [Universalist], of Macedon, officiated.

Mr. Thompson was born August 10, 1822 on the farm where he died. As a young man he taught school for several years, after which he engaged in the mercantile business in Rochester, Minnesota and Titusville, Pa. Since returning to his home he has lived with his nephew, D. M. Thompson.

Mr. Thompson was a bachelor and leaves one brother, Chauncey Thompson of Webster; four nephews, D. M. Thompson, R. C. Thompson [and] J. E. Thompson of Webster, and George W. Thompson of La Grange, Ill.; three nieces, Mrs. C. A. Cobb, Webster; Miss Susan A. Thompson, Rochester; Miss [Jessie?] Thompson, Beloit, Wis.

The burial took place in Webster Cemetery.
