FORT PLAIN, Dec. 3.—Charles L. Thurwood, 70, died suddenly Friday morning at about 9 o'clock at his home, Main street, this village. Mr. Thurwood, who for the past several weeks had been in poor health, arose as usual and started to walk when he toppled over to the floor and dying almost at once. Death was due to heart failure. For many years the deceased had been engaged in the furniture and undertaking business [businesses] in Fort Plain, and the last few years making a specialty of dealing in antique furniture. He retired from active business about two months ago. He was a well known resident of Fort Plain and had spent practically his entire life in this place. He was an attendant at the Universalist church. The survivors are his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Howard H. Kearns of Utica and Mrs. Warren Casler, this village, also several grandchildren. The funeral will be held from his home Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. Dr. Herbert F. Moulton, pastor of the Universalist church, officiating. Interment will be made in the Fort Plain cemetery.
