

[Trask, Norman]

Norman Trask died at his residence in this village on Friday of last week, after an illness of about two months. The funeral was held at his late residence Monday afternoon, Rev. Mr. Hewitt officiating. The interment was made at Boughton Hill. Mr. Trask was born in the south east part of this town, March 25th, 1817. The family is one of the oldest in that part of the town. He was a man of quiet habits, and very much devoted to his brothers and sisters and was especially happy in his home life. He lived on his farm in what is known as the "Trask" neighborhood till about twelve years ago when he moved to this village. He was not a member of any church, but his sympathies and support were always given to the Universalist denomination. Three sisters, Mary E., Delia C. and Lucinda M. Trask of this village, and two brothers, Cuyler Trask of Austinburgh, Ohio, and Lambert Trask of Petosky, Mich., survive him.
