TRIPP—Isaac Tripp, a well known lawyer in this city, died at his home, 58 Blandina street, Sunday, Feb. 23. Deceased was born in Floyd, Oneida county, November 16, 1821, and was educated in the common schools. Later he attended the Clinton Liberal Institute, and then the High School, being a classmate of Hon. C. M. Dennison. He taught School in Rome, Phelps, Ontario county, and Pope's Corners. Later he entered the Canandaigua Academy, where he prepared for college and went to Hobart College in Geneva and took a classical course, graduating in 1846. The same winter he came to Utica and studied law in the office of Samuel B. Garvin, and thence to the office of Edmund Bagg, where he finished his legal studies, and in 1848 was admitted to the bar in Albany. He taught in the Utica Free Academy awhile and then entered upon the practice of law, continuing in that profession since. Mr. Tripp was a member of the Universalist Church. In 1846 Mr. Tripp married Emily Rudman of Geneva, who is living. His children are: Mrs. Timour Lawrence of Whippam, N.J.; Mrs. Viola Garda of Brooklyn; Isaac, Albert and Lawrence of Utica. Of brothers he leaves five: Septimus of Freetown, Cortland county; William and Lafayette of McGrawville, Cortland county; Franklin and Florence, who live on the old homestead in Floyd. Of sisters he leaves Mrs. Jeanette Witherstein of North Steuben.
