DAWN TUCKER OF DOLGEVILLE FATALLY HURT Woman Dies in Hospital of Injuries Received in Early Morning Crash

DOLGEVILLE—Mrs. Dawn Tucker, 48, of 40 Spencer street, this village, was fatally injured early yesterday morning when the car she was operating was in a collision with another operated by Edward Cramer of Santa Clara, N. Y. Mrs. Tucker is said to have been at a party held by employes [employees] of the Melrose Slipper Company, Little Falls, at Walrath's hotel, which is south of Dolgeville. She had reached and entered the intersection of the road leading from the hotel and connecting with the main Little Falls Dolgeville highway. Cramer, driver of the other car, told police that he was proceeding north toward Dolgeville and his auto was struck on the right side by the Tucker machine as both were in the intersection.

Mrs. Tucker was moved to Little Falls Hospital, where she was found to have a crushed face, skull fracture, broken shoulder and broken hip. She died soon after she was admitted.

Cramer had as passengers in his car Carl Arnold, also of Santa Clara, and a man named Kelly from St. Regis Falls. Arnold told police the trio had drunk a few beers in Little Falls and were on the way to Dolgeville at the time of the accident.

Assistant Chief Harnett and Patrolman Colby of the Little Falls police investigated.

Mrs. Dawn Tucker was born December 14, 1892, in Salisbury, the daughter of William Sanderson and Viola Dunning Sanderson. She was united in marriage to William Tucker on April 28, 1910. He survives her, as does her father, William Sanderson; two sons, Leonard of Dolgeville and William of Middleville; one brother, Earl Sanderson.

Mrs. Tucker had been a resident of Dolgeville for 25 years. She was a member of the Universalist church, Rising Crown Rebekah Lodge, Clara Barton Circle and the Ladies Auxiliary of the Patriot Militants of Utlca. The funeral will be held tomorrow at 2 P.M. at the family home, 40 Spencer street. The Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton of the Universalist church will officiate. The casket will be placed in the Dolgeville cemetery vault to await burial in the Salisbury Center cemetery in the Spring.
