Death of Henry S. Tucker
Veteran Hotel and Business Man Dies at His Home

Henry S. Tucker died yesterday at his home, No. 68 Savannah street, aged 70 years. He had been ill for three months, after having suffered a light stroke.

Mr. Tucker had made his home in this city since 1887. He was born in Bath, Me., in October 1846. He went to Boston in his early youth, and engaged in the clothing business in that city for several years. From there he went to the oil fields of Pennsylvania and made his home in Bradford, Pa. for several years, being engaged as an oil producer and operator. He was also a member of the Bradford Oil Exchange.

Mr. Tucker came to Rochester in 1887 to take charge of the old National Hotel and conducted it for two years. Later he conducted the Waverly House at State and Central avenue. For several years Mr. Tucker was the representative in this city of various stock brokerage houses, and of late he conducted the Turkish Bath Hotel.

Mr. Tucker was a prominent Mason, and a member of the Knights Templar in Bradford, Pa. The funeral services will be held to-morrow afternoon from his late home, with Rev. A. W. Grose [pastor of the First Universalist Church] officiating.

Mr. Tucker leaves his wife, Edith C. Tucker; four sons, Harry W. Tucker of Bath, Maine, George B. and Arthur R. Tucker of this city, and Richard [?] Tucker of Chicago; a sister, Mrs. J. A. Phillips of Watertown, Mass., and a granddaughter, Virginia Tucker.
