RICHARD E. TUCKER, 41, FORMER RESIDENT, DEAD

Richard E. Tucker, formerly of this city, died yesterday at his home in Chicago, aged 41 years. He leaves his wife, Carrie Elton Tucker; his mother, Edith C. Tucker; two brothers, Arthur R. Tucker, of New York and George R. Tucker, of this city, and a niece, Virginia Tucker, of New York.

Mr. Tucker was born at Bradford, Pa., and came to this city at the age of five. For a number of years he worked in the advertising department of the Rochester Evening Times, which position he left to take charge of the automobile section of the Minneapolis Tribune. At the time of his death he was connected with the (Ho??) Advertising Agency of Chicago, specializing in advertising for the Jewett Motor Company.

The funeral will take place at 3 o'clock this afternoon from the home of his brother, George B. Tucker, No. 110 Harvard street. Burial will be in Riverside Cemetery.
