MRS. VIOLET TULLOCK, WELL KNOWN FORT PLAIN RESIDENT, DIES FOLLOWING LONG ILLNESS

Widow of Kelly Tullock, Civil War Veteran, Claimed at Advanced Age of Eighty-Eight Years; Deceased Was Public Spirited Woman Erecting the Soldiers' Monument on the G.A.R. Plot in Fort Plain Cemetery in Memory of Her Husband

FORT PLAIN.—Mrs. Violet Tullock, 88, died at her home Monday night in the Freys Bush section of this town [Minden], after an illness of some months. Mrs. Tullock was the widow of Kelly Tullock, who died some years ago [in 1925]. She was well known and had always lived in this town. She was a daughter of the late Philip Failing and Lany Nellis Failing, and was born January 8, 1842.

Several years ago Mrs. Tullock had the beautiful rest house built in the Fort Plain cemetery in memory of her father and mother. Mrs. Tullock also had erected the soldiers' monument that is on the G.A.R. plot in the cemetery, in memory of her husband who was a veteran of the Civil War.

The remains were taken to the Swartz undertaking rooms here and later removed to the home of Mrs. Ralph Alter, Reid street.

The survivors are two nieces, Mrs. Flora Gage and Mrs. Frank Van Valkenburgh, Canajoharie; three great nieces, Mrs. Ralph Alter, Mrs. Elgie Saltsman and Mrs. Mary Nellis, Fort Plain; three great nephews, George Failing, Chauncey Moyer and Jacob Moyer, Fort Plain.

A prayer service will be held at the home of Mrs. Alter Thursday at 2 P.M. and funeral services at the Catherine Nellis Memorial Chapel at 2:30, Rev. Rufus H. Dix, pastor of the Fort Plain Universalist church, officiating. Interment will be made in Fort Plain cemetery.
