FUNERAL OF MRS. TUPPER Held at Parishville on Thursday Rev. R. B. Whitman Conducts the Services

Rosina Bosworth Tupper was born in Parishville, Jany. 1, 1834, and died Aug. 7, 1917. For many years the Tupper families were familiar figures in the business and social life of the town. Daily we met them on the street and at the various places of enjoyment and social diversion. As a family they were honest, genial and generous. Five years ago Mr. Pitt Tupper succumbed to the infirmities of advanced years. He was quickly followed by Bera Hart, his son-in-law, and Bert, his only son. With the death of his widow on Tuesday the Tupper family is gone from the village. While Mrs. Tupper had no children of her own she was a true mother to her husband's children who lost their own mother while they were guite young. There were three of them, Bert, Mrs. Bera [Ernestine] Hart and Mrs. Fearl. The daughters were all present at the funeral, Mrs. Bert Tupper coming from Washington and Mrs. Fearl from Massachusetts. Mrs. Tupper's religious sympathies were with the Universalist Church and her faith was strong and abiding. She has left with us the impress of a life that was ever kind, peaceable, gentle, sociable. Surviving besides those mentioned are three sons of Mrs. Bera Hart: Roy, Carrol and Guy, also their sister Mrs. Val Metzger, all of Syracuse. Carrol and Guy were able to be present at the funeral, which took place Thursday afternoon from her home. Rev. Whitman conducted a brief service, followed by the ritual of the Eastern Star, of which order Mrs. Tapper had long been a loyal member.
