WILLIAM M. TURNER, 67, CHURCH TRUSTEE, DIES

William Martin Turner, 67 years old, a trustee of the Universalist Church of the Good Tidings, and a member of its building committee, active in the erection of the handsome new edifice at Stuyvesant ave. and Madison st., died yesterday, of heart trouble, at his residence, 426 Halsey st. His funeral services, on Thursday evening at 8 o'clock, will be conducted by his pastor, the Rev. C. H. Vail, and the interment will be at Woodbridge, N.J. Mr. Turner was born in old New York City on Nov. 17, 1852, the son of William H. and Rebecca C. Turner. He had been a resident of Brooklyn for 30 years, and was for many years in the wholesale woolen business in Manhattan, retiring only last summer on account of his health. He was formerly with the old firm of Wendell, Fay and Company for more than 30 years, and at the time of his retirement was connected with the Allen Lane Company. He was a member of Philadelphos Council No 562, R. A. Mr. Turner is survived by his wife, Mrs. Margaret Rutan Turner; a daughter, Miss Eva Gertrude Turner, and two brothers, Barry C. and Clarence F. Turner.
