The remains of Ransom Tuttle of Anaconda, Montana, was brought to Cuba for burial last Tuesday. Deceased was born in Salisbury, Herkimer Co., N. Y., in 1826, and he was was of the many who went to California in 1849, via the Panama route. He returned to this state in 1855 and was married to Lucinda Avery, daughter of the late Wyllys Avery of Salisbury, in 1855. They moved to Cuba Summit in 1868, where he and his brother-in-law, the late Elijah Helmer, bought a large farm. Mrs. Tuttle died in 1874 and he shortly afterwards started again for the West, spending some years in Lincoln, Neb., Black Hills, etc. He then went to Anaconda, where he died the 9th of this He leaves two brothers, Rev. Dr. Harvey Tuttle [Universalist] of month. Minneapolis, and Mr. Chauncey Tuttle of Freetown, N. Y., and one sister, Mrs. Chauncey Ives of Fairfield, N. Y. Short services were held at the cemetery here, conducted by Rev. A. C. Prescott of Cuba, and Rev. [Francis M.] Alvord [Universalist] of Friendship.
