Copenhagen, Mar. 14.—John Davenport Twining, eldest son of W. J. Twining, died at the family home near this village Wednesday night, aged 17 years. He had been in poor health for some time, but had been able to attend school until two weeks ago when his case became critical. Anaemia with other complications was the cause of his death. He is survived by his father and one brother, Ashley. His mother's death occurred four years ago. The funeral was held Tuesday at 2 o'clock from the home, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed of the Universalist church of Watertown officiating. The bearers were four of his school friends, Sidney Checkering, Clifford Parsons, Glenn Lewis and Elton Young. Interment was made at Riverside cemetery.
