NELSON P. TWINING

Well Known Resident of Copenhagen Dies
at Home of His Daughter in South Rutland

Nelson P. Twining, aged 68 years, a well known resident of Copenhagen, died early Sunday morning at the home of his daughter, Mrs. C. W. Cramer, in South Rutland. Mr. Twining had experienced several periods of ill health but his condition was not considered serious. He retired to his room late Saturday evening in his usual health. The following morning when his relatives called him, no answer was received. Upon entering the bedroom he was found dead and had apparently expired several hours previously. Death was due to heart trouble.

He was born in South Champion, Oct. 12, 1847, the son of Alfred and Jeanette Twining. His father was a native of South Champion and his mother of Wilna. The greater part of his life had been spent in Copenhagen where he successfully conducted a farm for several years. About six months ago his wife died and he has since made his home with his daughter in South Rutland.

Besides his daughter, Mrs. Cramer, he leaves a son, Dr. Lewis Twining, of Bordiano [Borodino?], N.Y.; two sisters, Mrs. Henry Chickering of Copenhagen, and Imogene Teanchan, of Iowa; and two grandchildren.

Funeral services were held from the Cramer home Tuesday afternoon at 1 o'clock, Rev. Harry Westbrook Reed, pastor of All Soul's Universalist church of Watertown, officiating. Interment was made in South Rutland cemetery.
