Jay W. Underhill, aged about 37 years, who had been sick but a week with pneumonia, died Saturday, the 4th. Good natured and of a jolly disposition, he had many friends. What seems a little strange, he was one of the signers as a witness to A. W. Blakely's will—both being in good health at the time[, ] and since Mr. Blakely's death, April 4th, he had been to Buffalo and acknowledged his signature, at the time the will was probated, and just two months from the day Mr. Blakely died, Jay also passed away. He leaves a father [John] and a mother [Jane Whiting], one brother [Frank], two sisters [Mrs. George Davidson and Mrs. Louise Deltz], a wife and a little three year old daughter and many friends to mourn his loss.

The family have [sic] the sympathy of all in their bereavement. The funeral was held at the church here Tuesday, a Universalist minister from Buffalo, the one who married them, officiating, assisted by the Springville choir. Interment at North Boston [in Maple Wood Cemetery].
