DEATHS.

Yes, she replied, 'glory to God, it grows brighter;' this was about the last she ever uttered, for the last three days of her life; she appeared unconscious of surrounding objects; the desire of her heart was granted her, for her life calmly passed away, without a struggle, like one falling to sleep, in anticipation of pleasant dreams.

Thus we have another proof, not of the truth of the faith she possessed, but of its all-supporting power, not only in life, but in death; she found it good to live by, and thanks to our Redeemer, she found it equally good to die by. Her funeral was attended by a numerous concourse of weeping friends, mourning the loss of departed worth, and a sermon delivered by Ev. A. Orton from 1 Cor. xv:51.
