Zula M., the fifteen-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred H. Van Liew, passed away early Saturday morning at the home of her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Richard Hicks, of Auburn. She became ill last January and in July was removed to her grandparents' home where it was hoped that she would gain strength and recover.

She entered Union springs High School in September, 1919, where she showed remarkable ability as a student, her average at the end of the first quarter being second highest in the high school department. She was very popular with both teachers and schoolmates and was greatly beloved by all who knew her. Her loss will be deeply mourned.

Besides her parents [Fred and Louise] she is survived by five brothers, John, Charles, Ralph, George and Myron.

The funeral services were held from her late home in the town of Ledyard on Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. John Price of the First Universalist Church of Auburn officiating. two duetts [sic], "Sometime We'll Understand" and "There'll Be No Night There" were rendered by Mrs. Frank Austin and Mrs. Frank [Sarah Van Liew] Wood. She was laid to rest in the family plot in Fleming beside her twin sister, Lula, who died in infancy [in 1906].

The bearers were four cousins, Austin and Warren Van Liew, Herbert Loveland and Avery Wood.

There were many beautiful floral tributes from sympathizing friends.
