Mrs. Floyd Van Slyke Dies at Dolgeville

Dolgeville, August 18.—Mrs. Floyd Van Slyke died at her home, 170 South Main street, Dolgeville, at 10:45 Saturday evening. She has been in ill health for some time and returned home after receiving treatment at the Cooperstown hospital about 10 days ago. She was employed at the Melrose Slipper company plant, Little Falls, until ill health forced her to quit work some months ago.

Deceased was born in the town of Manheim, November 26, 1894, daughter of Ira and Ela [Ella] Briggs Silvernail. She had lived in this community practically all her life and was well known and highly regarded. She was a member of the Universalist church and the local American Legion Auxiliary. On June 26, 1918, she was married to Floyd Van Slyke, who survives, with her mother, Mrs. Ella Silvernail, of Dolgeville; five daughters, Mrs. Geo. Pfannebecker, Mrs. Earl Olsen and Ellen, Jane, and Linda Van Slyke, all of Dolgeville; two sons, Floyd Jr. and Herbert, also of Dolgeville; two brothers, Fred Silvernail, Norwood, Mass. and Floyd of Cold Brook; one sister, Mrs. Mae Green, Dolgeville.

The funeral will be private and will be held from the home at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon, Rev. C. [Clinton] A. Moulton, pastor of the Universalist church officiating. Burial will be made in the West Johnsville cemetery.
