Floral Park, Feb. 16—Funeral services will be conducted tomorrow night at the home of George Van de Bogart, 72, 54 Emerson Ave., Floral Park, where he died suddenly Thursday. The Rev. H. Elmer Peters, pastor of the Universalist Church of Floral Park, will officiate.

Mr. Van de Bogart, a former newspaperman, was purchasing director of the Carnation Milk Sales Company, Manhattan. He joined the Mohawk Milk Company, which was consolidated with the Carnation company, 35 years ago.

In his youth Mr. Van de Bogart was a member of the Hudson, N.Y., Register. He was born in Hudson and lived there until 1907 when he moved to Brooklyn. He lived in Brooklyn for nine years, moving to Floral Park in 1916.

Another funeral service will be held Monday afternoon in Hudson. Burial will be in the Cedar Park Cemetery there.

Surviving are his widow, Mae, and a daughter, Miss Leonore Van de Bogart.

#### A LEGACY FOR FLORAL PARK

A decade ago, George Van de Bogart of Floral Park died and by his will the Universalist Church in Floral Park was named to receive a share in his residuary estate. He had been a life-long Universalist, with membership in the church at Hudson which ceased to function about 25 years ago. His wife and daughter had life use of the estate and the death of both occurred during the past year. Mr. Van de Bogart was an executive of the Mohawk Milk Company which is now a subsidiary of the Carnation Milk Company. He was always a generous contributor to Universalist causes.

The amount which will be paid to the church by the executors will be about \$19,000. The parish is arranging the purchase of a house and lot in Floral Park which will meet its parsonage need and at the same time provide land for the new location of the church, if this is deemed advisable.
