MRS. VIOLA O. VANHORNE

Mrs. Viola O. VanHorne, widow of Myron VanHorne, died July 3d at Washington, D. C., where she had been visiting.

She was born at Van Hornesville¹ June 19, 1856, the daughter of Milton and Eliza Marie (Overacker) Countryman. Mrs. VanHorne has been a life-long resident of Van Hornesville until they moved to Pierstown in 1912, where they were engaged in farming. Eight years later they moved to Springfield Center where they lived until four years ago when she went to Ilion to make her home with her nephew, TenEyck VanHorne. She was a life-long member of the Van Hornesville Universalist church.

The survivors are one grandson, Lieut. Jack VanHorne, now with the U.S. Army in Persia; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Dudley VanHorne of Binghamton; and three nephews, TenEyck VanHorne of Ilion, O.L. VanHorne of Cooperstown, and Leon D. VanHorne of Bedford, Ohio.

The funeral was held at 2 p.m. Thursday from the Methodist church at Van Hornesville with the Rev. Mr. Watkins of Jordanville officiating. Burial at Van Hornesville.
