DIED, In Rochester, April 20, Mr. Henry L. Vervalin, aged 41. He had been a resident of this city for about twenty-five years, and by a kindly deportment, industry and strict business integrity, won the highest position as a man and a citizen. When quite a young man he became a believer in the salvation of all, and attached himself to the Universalist congregation, where he continued a constant attendant and worshipper to the last... In his death the city has lost a most estimable citizen, and the Universalist Society one of its best members, while to his family the loss is wholly irreparable. A large circle of personal friends who knew and loved him, mingle their tears with those of the bereaved widow. His funeral was attended from his late residence on the 22d by a large concourse of the citizens of Rochester.
