SAMUEL D. VORIS, SOLD ART SUPPLIES

Samuel D. Voris of 1719 Newkirk Ave., a salesman for Eugene Dietzgen Company, Manhattan, manufacturers of surveying instruments and art supplies, died Sunday at Brooklyn Hospital, where he had been a patient for two weeks. He had been in poor health for several years.

Mr. Voris, who had been associated with the manufacturing concern for more than 40 years, was born in Scranton, Pa. He was a descendant of early Dutch settlers on Long Island and was a member of the Van Voorhees Association, the Long Island Historical Society and the Milwood Lodge of Masons.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Pearl D. Voris; a daughter, Mrs. Charles Brattig; and two twin granddaughters, Barbara and Susan Brattig.

Funeral services will be held at 8:30 p.m. tomorrow at the Fairchild Chapel, 951 Atlantic Ave., with the Rev. Dr. Cornelius Greenway, pastor of All Souls Universalist Church, Ocean and Ditmas Aves., officiating. There also will be Masonic rites.
