Adelbert A. Wadsworth, for several years a resident of Holley, and formerly of Clarendon, died at his home in Rochester Friday, August 2. Mr. Wadsworth was born on the Wadsworth farm at Bennett's Corners, and save for a few years spent in Michigan, has always lived in this vicinity. Mr. Wadsworth was a man who had many friends. He was a most accommodating neighbor and was generous almost to a fault. One might say of him as Goldsmith wrote of his father, "E'en his faults lean toward virtue's side."

He leaves to mourn of his immediate family, his widow [Anna Jesson Wadsworth]; two daughters, Miss Ada and Mrs. B. Alberts; one son, Harmon, and a sister, Mrs. Wm. Edmonds of Brockport. The funeral was held in the chapel at Hillside, where interment was made. Rev. L. [Lewis] H. Robinson, pastor of the Universalist church of Clarendon, of which Mr. Wadsworth had long been a member, officiated at the service.
