BELOVED LADY DEATH'S VICTIM
Mrs. Margaret G. Wagner Dies at Her Home After Long Illness

FORT PLAIN—Mrs. Margaret Garlock Wagner, 84, widow of Harvey Wagner, died Monday night at her home on Mohawk street, after having been in failing health for some time past. Mrs. Wagner was a well known resident of Fort Plain of which village she had been a resident for the past quarter of a century.

Previous to coming to Fort Plain she lived on the Wagner farm in the Seebers Lane section of the Town of Canajoharie. Mrs. Wagner was born January 7, 1846, a daughter of the later Peter and Lany Loucks Garlock, in the town of Canajoharie, and she had always lived in this section.

Mrs. Wagner was an attendant at the Universalist church and always took an interest in the church work and was at the services when her health permitted.

The survivors are four daughters, Mrs. Ida Jackson, Mrs. Charles C. Washburn, Miss Ola Wagner, of Fort Plain [and] Mrs. Waldo T. Hunter of Brooklyn; a son, Dr. Charles P. Wagner, died several years ago at St. Johnsville. Mrs. Wagner is also survived by several grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

The funeral services will be held from her late home, Thursday at 3:30 P.M., the Rev. Rufus Hopkins Dix, pastor of the Fort Plain Universalist church officiating. Interment will be made in the Fort Plain cemetery.
