MRS. JACOB WAGNER

Melinda Ann Hayward, wife of Jacob Wagner, passed from this life, Thursday evening, May 30, 1918, at her home on Dansville street, aged 67 years. Mrs. Wagner had been ill about three years with a nervous trouble, being confined to the house most of the time.

Deceased was a daughter of Nathaniel and Martha Hayward, and was born at Wayland February 10, 1851. During the year of 1867, she was united in marriage with Jacob Wagner who survives her. They have been residents of Cohocton during the fifty-one years of companionship, residing on Dansville street, their present home, for nearly thirty years.

Seven children survive their mother as follows: Mrs. Rose Glover, Mrs. Elsie Maichle, Erve and Leon Wagner of this place; Mrs. Ida Jincks and James Wagner of Hornell; and Harriet Wagner of Rochester. Also eleven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Beside the husband and children, one sister, Mrs. Marie Hartwell of Arkport, one brother, Frank Hayward, and a half-brother, Theodore Hayward of this place, survive Mrs. Wagner.

Mrs. Wagner was a faithful member of the Universalist church and of the W.R.C., where she will be sadly missed as well as in the home that is left vacant.

The funeral was held from the home Sunday afternoon at three o'clock, Rev. Clara Morgan of Perry, conducting the service. The interment was in Maple View cemetery.

The W.R.C. attended in a body and conducted the service at the cemetery.
